



Great Land Run 5K and 10K TEAM CHALLENGE

Who: Any business, organization, club, or group

What: A team challenge was started in 2014 to award 2 traveling trophies each year at the Great Land Run. The trophies are awarded to teams based on (1) number of finishers as a percentage of the team's total number of employees/members (minimum number of employees/members: 8) and (2) fastest average finish time for the 5K. The trophy is inscribed with the winning team's name each year. In 2020, we added an additional trophy for fastest average finish time for the 10K.

When: September 20, 2025 7:30 am

Where: Red Bird Farm, 8812 US-81

Why: To promote health, fitness, and camaraderie within a business, organization, club or group through a friendly competition at the Great Land Run. Each participant will also receive a long-sleeved tech shirt and finishers medal.

What we need: A team coordinator who will (1) maintain a list of team members to submit to the running club coordinator (Eve Switzer, enidrunningclub@gmail.com) by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 17th</u> and (2) provide the running club coordinator with a *total number of employees/members of the business/organization/club/group*.

There are 2 ways in which we encourage a team to be formed.

- (1) Each team member register and pay for themselves online (itsyourrace.com) or via mail-in paper registration (\$35 for the 5K, \$40 for the 10K, \$65 for the half marathon) **or**
- (2) The team manager ensures and collects from each team member a completed paper registration form (download from greatlandrun.com) and submits those forms along with payment to the Enid Running Club by <u>Sunday, August 31st</u> (to guarantee race shirts).

Team managers may either instruct their team members to attend packet pick up on Friday, September 19th or a team manager may pick up all team packets at packet pick up on the morning of the race.

A team member must be an employee or member of that business, organization, club, or group. Spouses and children are encouraged to participate but would not be considered a team member. Students from a school district may be included on that district or school's team.
